

Twice in recent months, St. Edward's students have been stunned into reality by the death of two young boys, who had, not too long ago, walked among them. Twice they have seen that death is not solely a climax to senility, but may also be an early chapter in the story of one's existence. Edsmen have sufficient reason to believe that these boys, Charles Croak and Alfonso Garcia, true exemplars of the Christian concept of life, have already been embraced into the Kingdom of Heaven to enjoy their eternal reward.

Charles Coak was but a member of last year's eighth grade class. He was very young, considered by many too young to die. In apparent good health, and of good intelligence, Charles was an avid lover of athletics, Last year some students did not even know Charlie was around, But he was soon brought into the eyes and hearts of every Edsman when, after losting a cancerous leg, he courageously wheeled about the campus, smiling and cheefful as though nothing had happened. He was truly an inspiration, Unfortunately the cancer was incurable, and it was known that soon Charles would pass away. With unusual courage, humflity, and resignation to the will of God, personally asking for the last sacraments, Charles Coak died at his home in Houston on the moming of September 26.

The news of the death of Alfonso Garcia was both shocking and unexpected. He left his friends last year with good-byes and promises that he would return this year. For those who did not know him, Alfonso Garcia was born in Mexico City and had attended St. Edward's for the past two years, Last year he was a member of the freshman class and was known by many simply as "El Muneco." Lively and comical, he was also a boy seriously concerned about his soul.

This summer at camp, a "freak" accident occurred in which he lost his life. The news of this tragic event was a shock to everyone who knew him. Alfonson was an outstanding example of the 8t. Edward's man. He frequented the sacraments many times a week thus strengthening himself spiritually, in fact, on the day previous to his death, he had received both confession and communion. He set an example for all to follow: in every sense of the word, a St. Edward's man.





#### CHAPLAIN



REV. JOSEPH M. RICK, C.S.C.

Father Rick is a native Texan born in Houston. He attended the University of Notre Dame and played football under Knute Rockne. He was studying to be an engineer but then decided to enter the seminary there. This was in 1919, and in 1928 he was ordained a priest and began preparation for going to India as a missionary. Father was the first native of Houston to become a priest.

Since he knew he was going to India, he thought it would be a good idea to learn to fly. He was the first priest in the U.S. to get a pilot's license. He got to India in 1930 and gave the people some practical as well as spiritual help.

During World War II, from '43 to '45, he was auxiliary chaplain to the American, Indian, and African combined force in Burma. After his return, he was at Boys' Ranch at Bedford, Texas, serving as chaplain to the Brothers. From there, Father Rick came to St. Edward's, where he serves as chaplain for the High School and University.

### CHAPLAIN





REV. WILLIAM P. MELODY, C.S.C.

Father Melody was born in Mayo County, Ireland. He first came to the U.S. in 1947 and entered the Holy Cross Seminary at Notre Dame to study for the priesthood. Having completed high school there in three years, he entered the Novitiate of the Holy Cross Fathers in August, 1950. In 1954, he made his final profession in the Congregation of Holy Cross and graduated from the University of Notre Dame the following year. He pursued his theological studies at Holy Cross College in Washington, D.C., where he received the M.A. degree in 1959.

In Sacred Heart Church, Notre Dame, Father was ordained to the Priesthood, June 10, 1959. Then Father returned home to Ireland for his First Mass with his cousin priests, Father Patrick Peyton, CSC, Director of the Family Rosary Crusade, and Father Thomas Peyton, CSC, Pastor of Sacred

Heart Parish, New Orleans.

In '59 Father did graduate work in Social Studies at Notre Dame and in '60 he was assigned to Austin, Texas, where he is Chaplain and Spiritual Director for the Brothers in formation at Vincent Hall Scholasticate; Regional Director of Vocations for the Holy Cross Fathers in the Southwest; News Reporter for Holy Cross in the same region; Confessor to the High School and University; and in his spare time he conducts retreats and days of recollection for Religious and Laity, and helps in the surrounding parishes with Mass and Confessions on week ends.


