FOREWORD

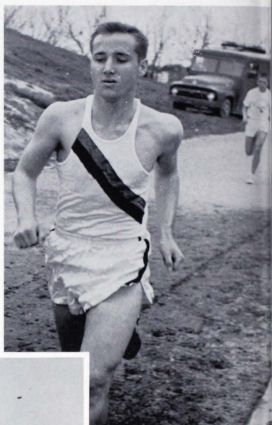

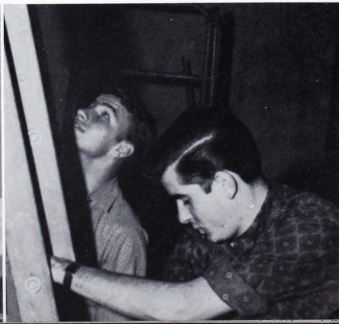

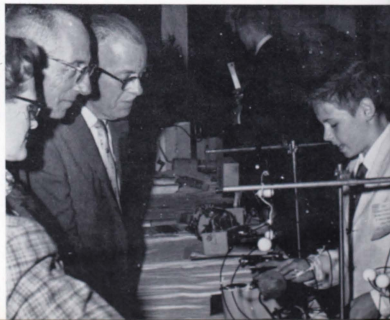
