## FOREWORD

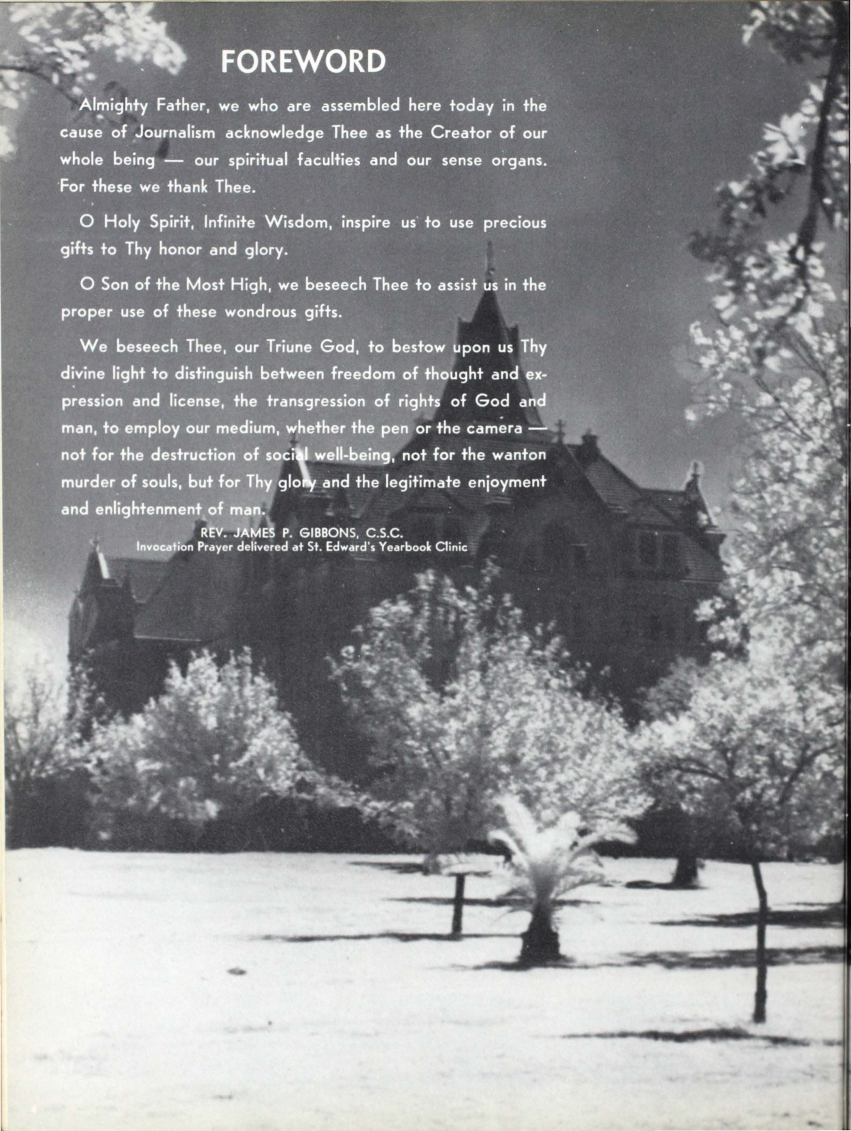

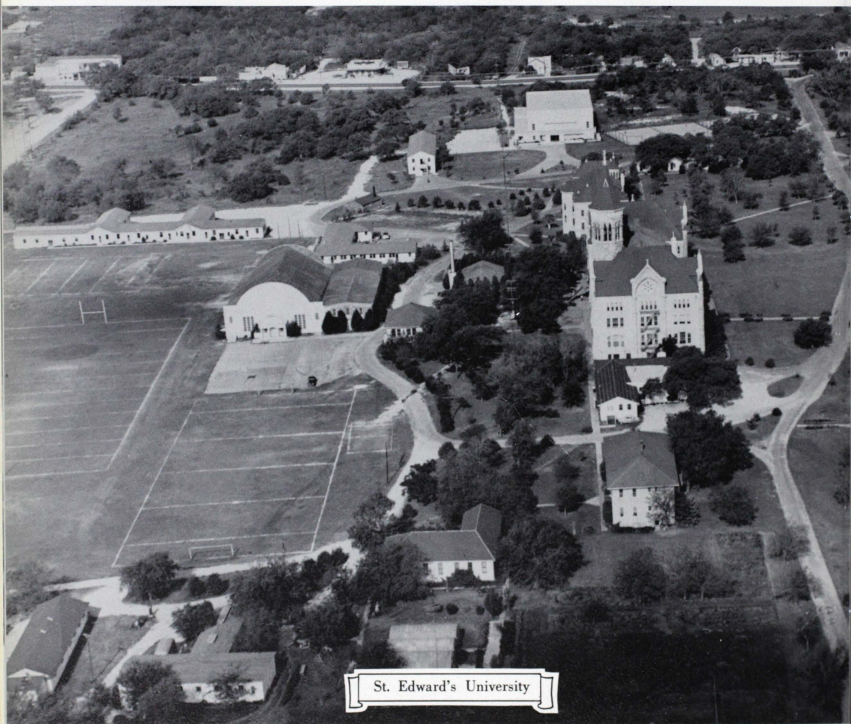


## DEDICATION

Gratefully we dedicate this annual to you, Brother Edmund.

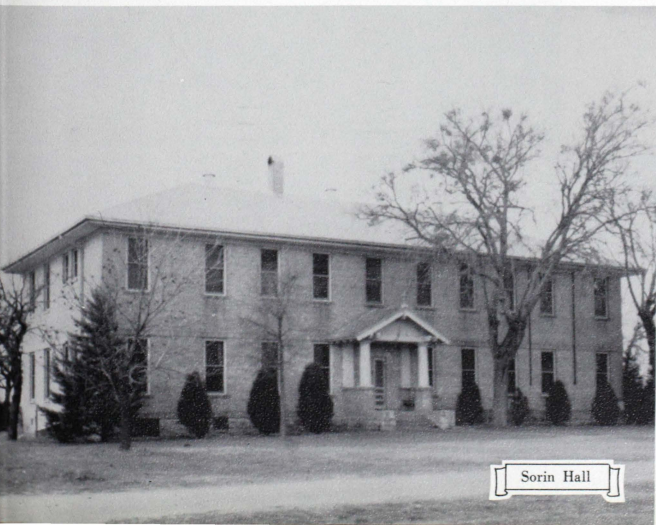

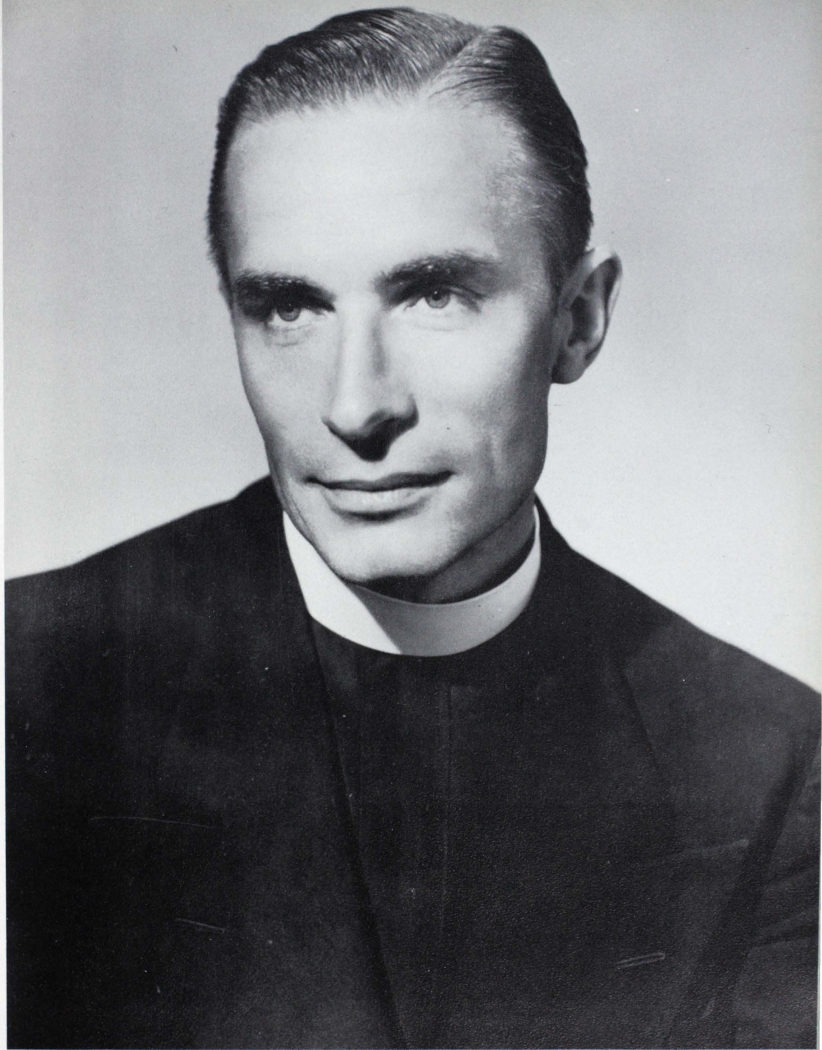
As for myself, I have too many roots in this college to allow me to say goodbye with any sort of finality or conviction.

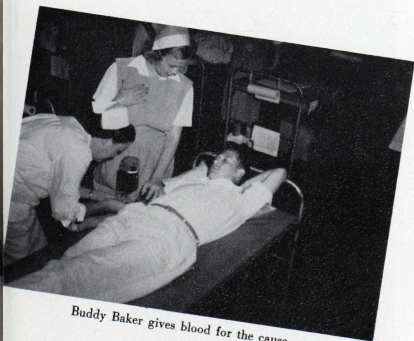

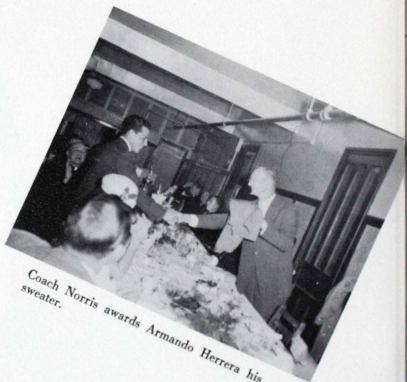

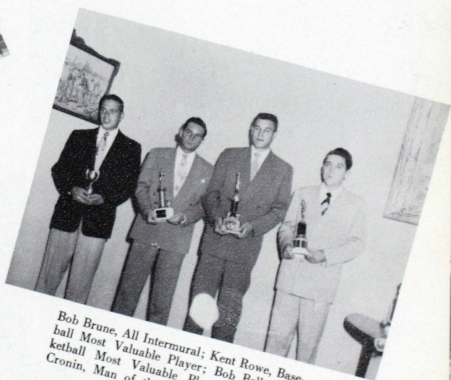

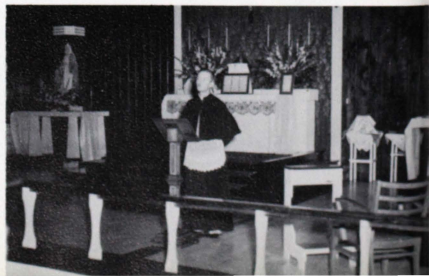

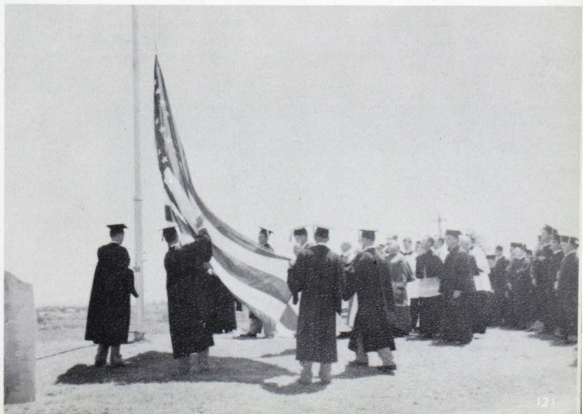

## MAN OF THE YEAR 1952

In addition to his many official duties, Cronin worked in the University athletic department.

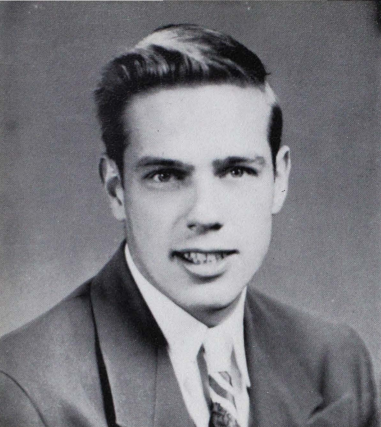
He was always active in student affairs. He was responsible for much of the decorating at the recent Alumni-Senior Ball among other things.

When Cronin graduates he intends to enter the frozen custard business in Chicago.

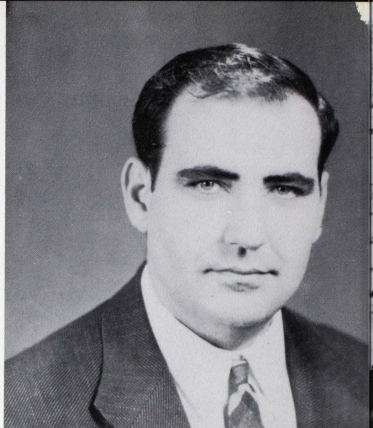
