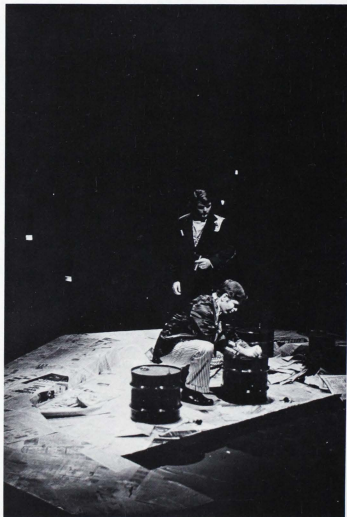


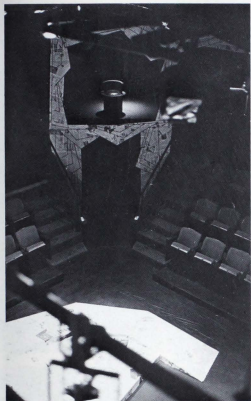




The Theater opened their season with "The Firebugs" which was an extremely good show.

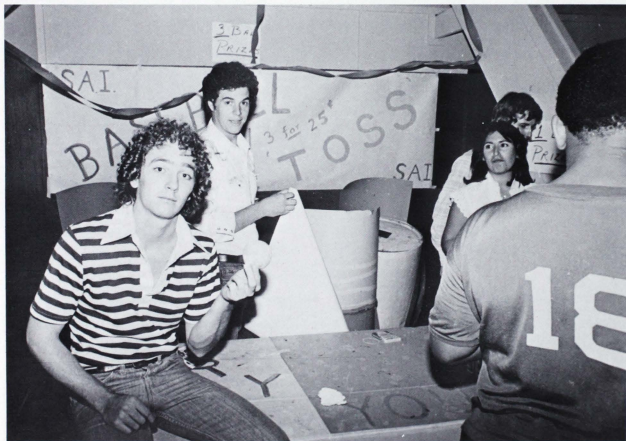

## HILTOPPER EDITOR DISMISSED

The *Hilltopper*, a St. Edward's student newspaper, resumed publication today after weeks of investigation concerning former editor Joe Morris.

On December 10, 1976, a meeting of the Publications Board was held for the purpose of investigating charges against Morris. These charges included misappropriation of advertising funds and assumption of the powers of the Publications Board. Morris was present at that meeting. After the charges were presented to Morris and he had responded, the Board voted unanimously to send a letter to Morris, directing him to appear for a dismissal hearing on Tuesday, January 24, 1977. His options were to appear at the hearing or resign as the editor. His decision was to be made by noon, December 16, 1977.

Morris called St. Agnes College on December 16 and advised that he would not appear for the hearing on Tuesday, January 24, 1977.

When the January 24th hearing was held, Morris did not appear in attendance were: Clai. Christen-

and Marcus Kohny, faculty staff representatives, and Rick Williams, advisor for the *Hilltopper*. Also present was Ted Margen, the Executive Assistant for S.A.I. John Morris had appointed Margen to the Board on the afternoon of the 24th to replace Mike Ritter. Since Margen was not present at the meeting on the 16th, it was ruled that he was not fully aware of the factors involved, and was not allowed to vote.

An account of the events of the 24th taken from a memo from Father Tom Womberg to the students, faculty and staff of SEU states:

"With Mr. Joe Morris absent and with the only evidence present being a record of the previous meeting, along with new evidence to support the charges and nothing to refute the charges, the Board's vote was from a unanimous vote to a 4-0 vote."

The Board indicated that writing the situation. Several members of the *Hilltopper* staff indicated in writing to Father Tom Womberg their

situation, and set on two tasks. One, ascertain whether Mr. Joe Morris should be retained as editor; two, recommend what alterations must be made in order to avoid such a situation in the future.

The committee was chaired by Brother James Hanson, with members Dr. Virginia Dukes and Mr. Peter O'Rourke. The committee held an open forum on Feb. 28, which was attended by Joe Morris, John Morris, several members of the *Hilltopper* staff, and other interested parties. The following day, the committee met individually with several people, and made a decision the next week.

This decision was to dismiss Joe Morris as the Editor of the *Hilltopper*, and to appoint Christine Lemmon as Interim Editor.

Rick Williams has been invaluable. He has been rushed to the point of expected exhaustion, yet he has still been able to help us when we needed it most.

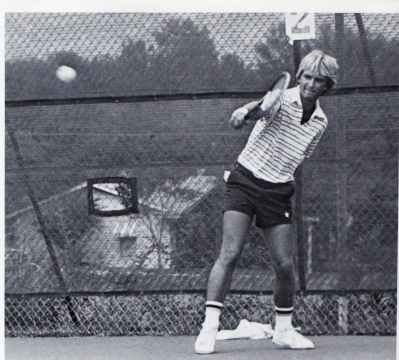
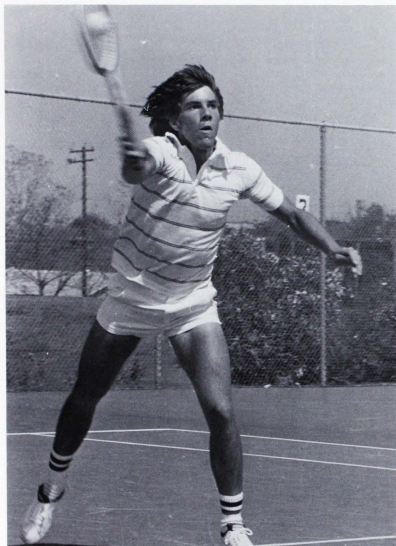
