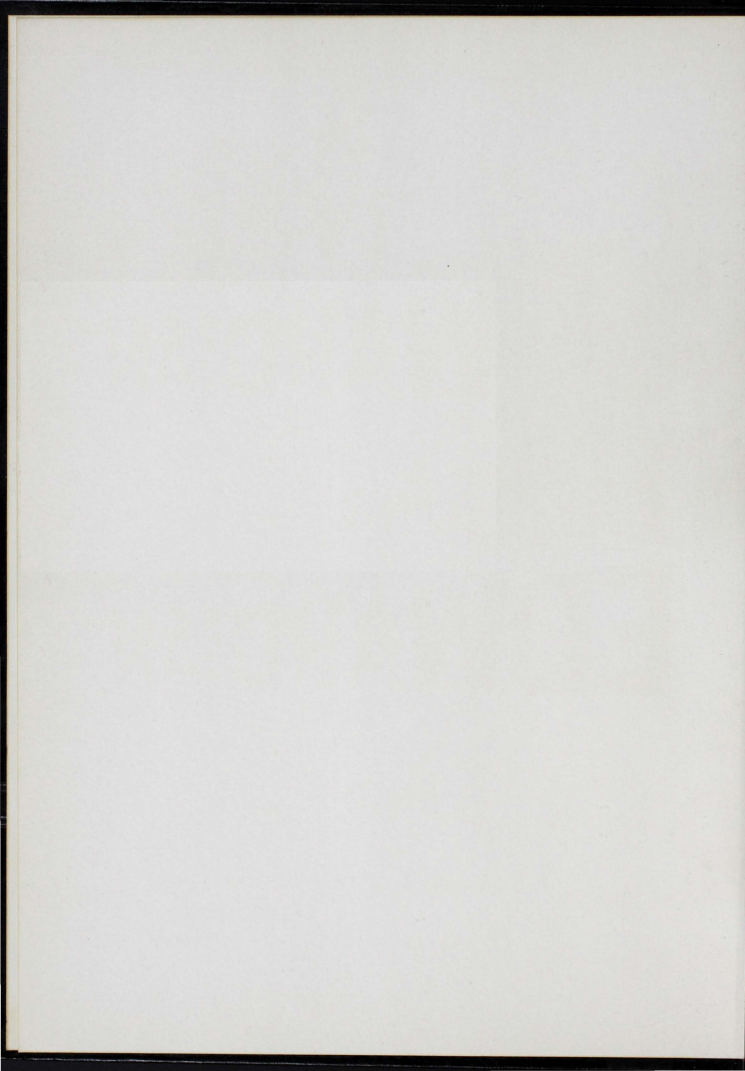
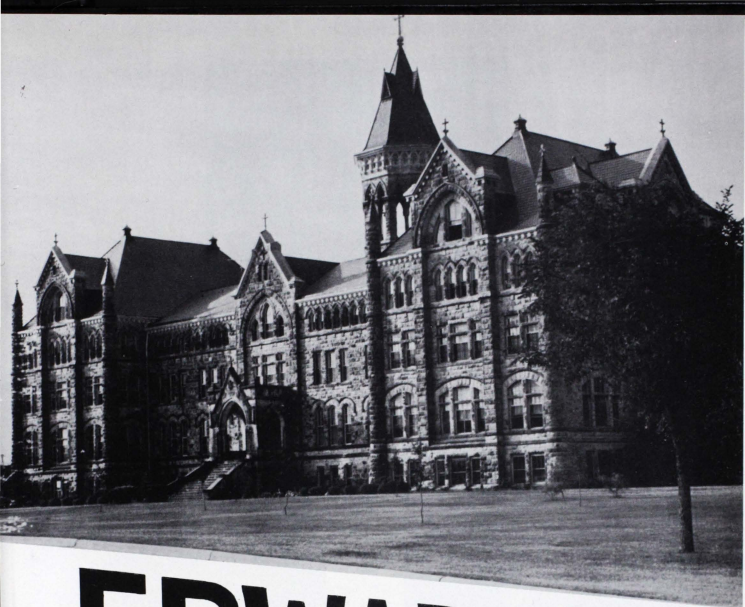

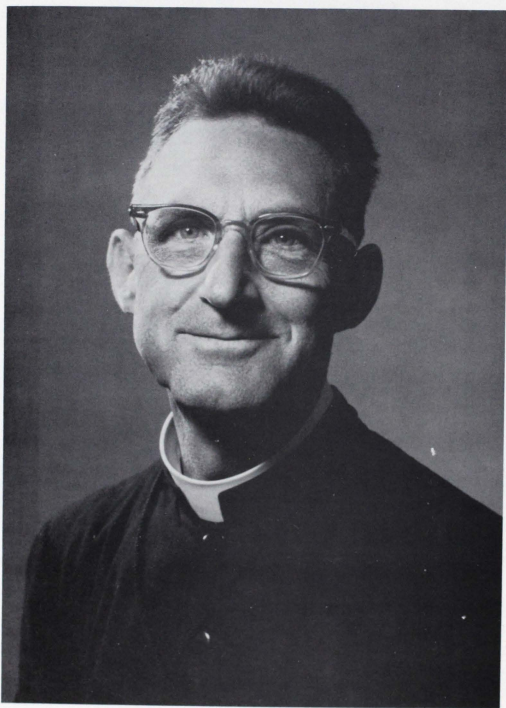


## FOREWORD

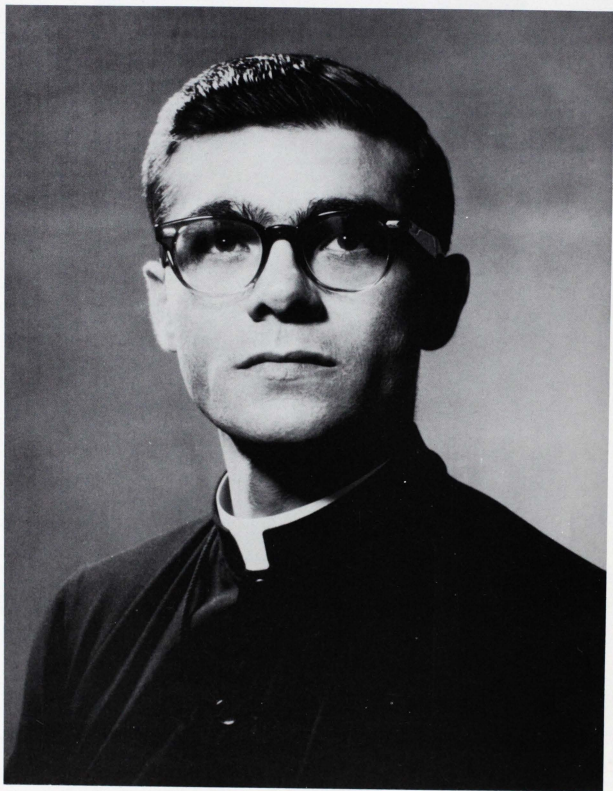
BROTHER JACOB EPPLEY, C.S.C

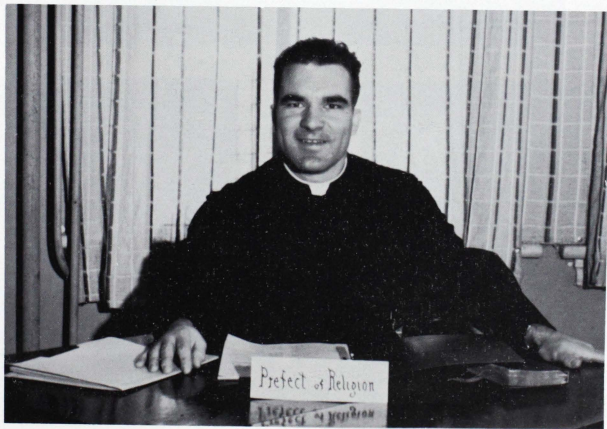
# THE COURIER
