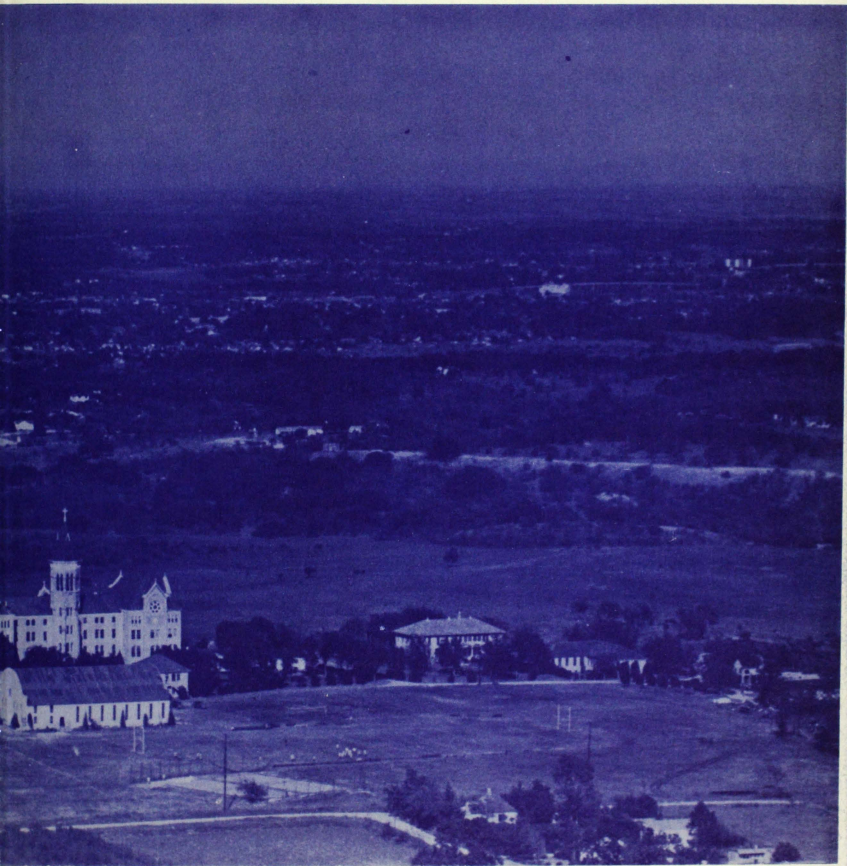

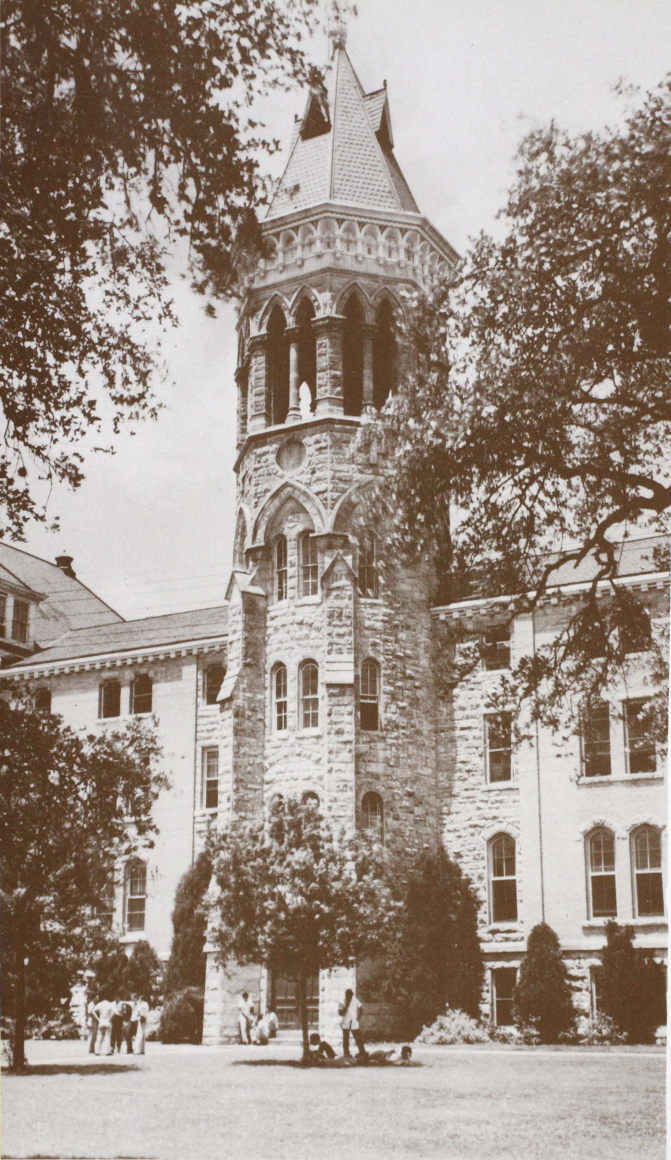

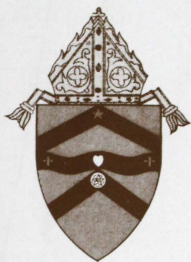

DEDICATION



On May 13, 1948, the Most Rev. Louis J. Reicher, D.D., LL.D., was consecrated the first Bishop of the newly formed Diocese of Austin in St. Mary's Cathedral. At that time Auxiliary Bishop William D. 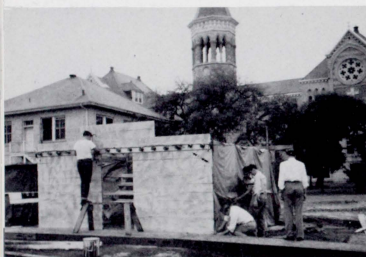
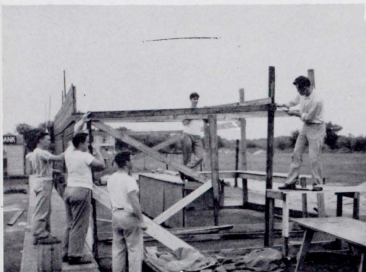


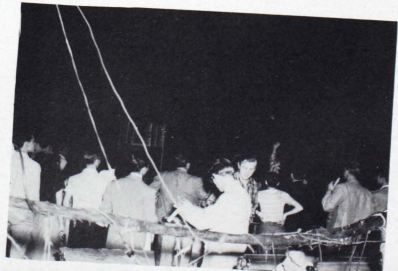
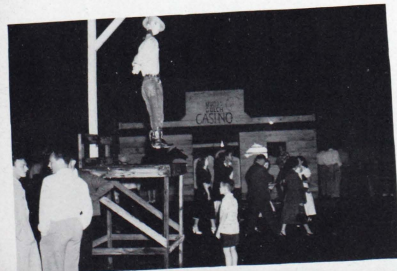




WESTERN CARNIVAL

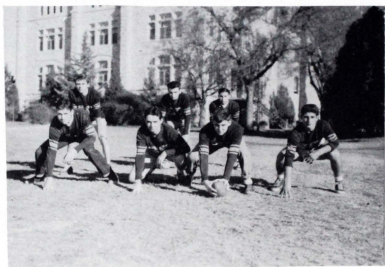


"Play for Fun" is the slogan at St. Ed's. Since intercollegiate sports are not over-emphasized, the intramural program has become the center of attraction on the campus.
