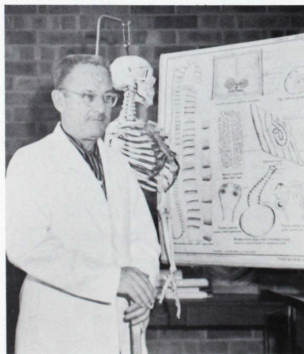

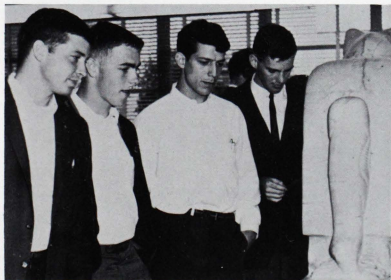

The group is small enough to insure participation by each member. Topics range as widely as the name suggests. Not the size of a group, but its eventual influence, is the measure of its designs.

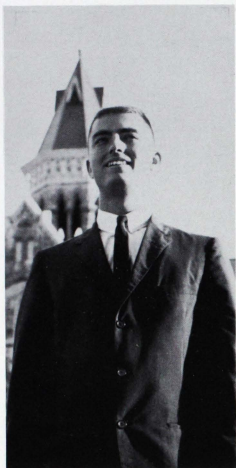

ST. EDWARD'S HALL OF FAME



John David Eckstein

James O'Keefe, another Hoosier senior quite proficient at the art of basketball, wound up a brilliant career on the Hilltop this season. "Slim" will go down into the record books as the most proficient rebounder that the school has ever known and his scoring feats have been among the most memorable of any ball player—who can forget when he sank those two free throws to defeat Southwest Texas State by one point.

Jim came to St. Ed's from South Bend where he learned the fine art of playing basketball. He played freshman ball in high school as a guard, but when sophomore year came he found himself off the team so that year he played town ball. Junior year he was back on the varsity but never came up to his full potential because he played behind some of the school's finest players.

Coming to St. Ed's, Jim found that there was a lot of hard work ahead of him if he wanted to make good in college ball. Through the tireless efforts of Coach Norris, and the counseling of his fellow ballplayers, Jim began to develop into the ball player he is today. Teamed with Jim Board, Phil White, and Dave Eckstein he provided the nucleus for some of the finest teams the Hilltop has seen in many a day.

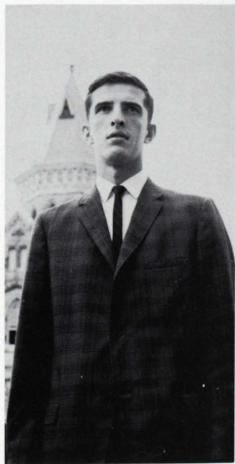
As a junior Jim had the distinction of being among the top five in rebounding around the country. He averages over 18 points a game in scoring while pulling down an average of 20.7 rebounds per game. Twice against St. Mary's he grabbed over 30 rebounds. That year he was named player of the year by the K of C, and also was named to the first team of the Catholic All-American.

John David Eckstein, an outstanding athlete at St. Ed's for the past four years, came to the hill from Anderson, Indiana after a successful career in high school sports. While at St. Mary's High School in Anderson, Dave lettered four times in baseball and three times in basketball. He holds many of the school's records for basketball, including the most points scored in one game when he tossed in 40. His record-breaking performances didn't go unnoticed since he was named most valuable player in his senior year, made two all-conference teams, and was named to the Indiana all-star team by the Hoosier Press. In baseball he was an all-conference selection as a senior.

When Dave came to the Hilltop, he picked up right where he left off in high school. For the past four years he has been one of the standout ball players in the Big State Conference in both baseball and basketball. He started out in his first year by tossing in 19 points in the first game and has been putting them through with regularity ever since. This past year Dave led the team in scoring, and on a couple of occasions he scored more than 30 points in a single game.

Among the honors that Dave has won in his four years on the Hill are: being named to the UPI All-American honorable mention squad, four years as an all-conference player in the Big State Conference, athlete of the year as a junior and senior by the Press Club, and K of C player of the year in both baseball and basketball in his senior year.

Dave Eckstein is certainly a credit to St. Edward's. He has progressed to the status of an All-American athlete who stands alone in Hilltop annals.
