

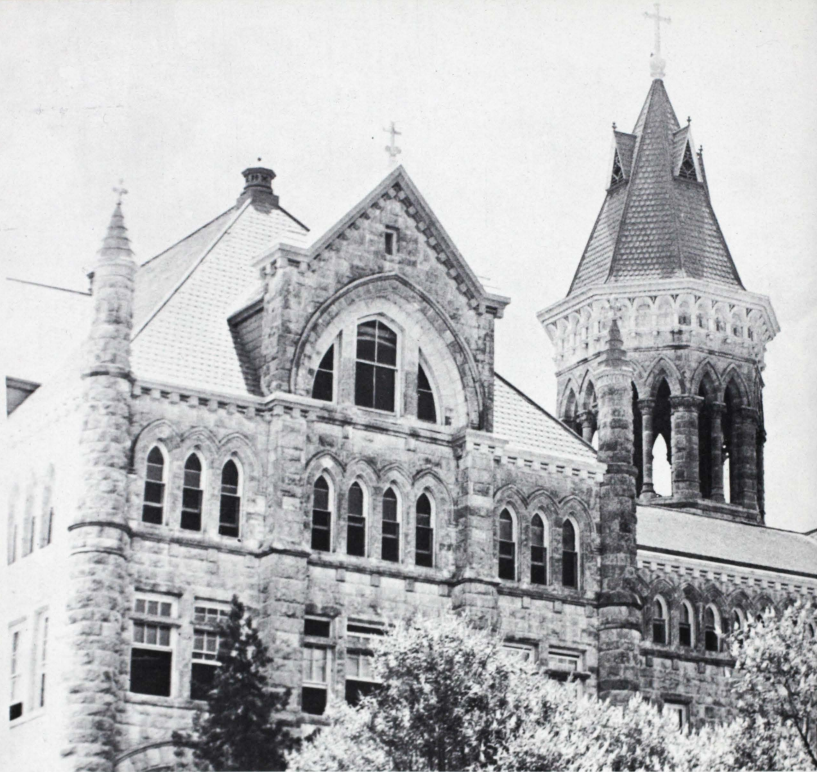

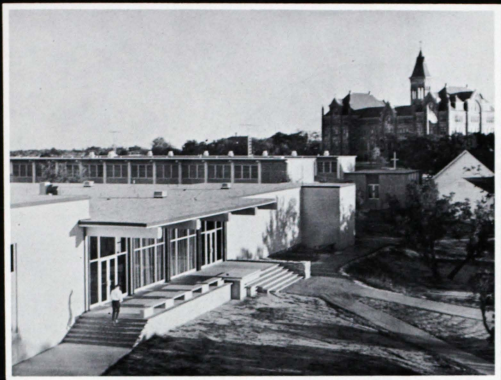
F O R E W O R D

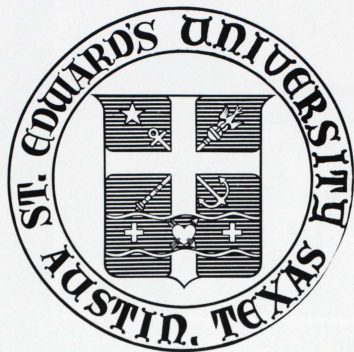

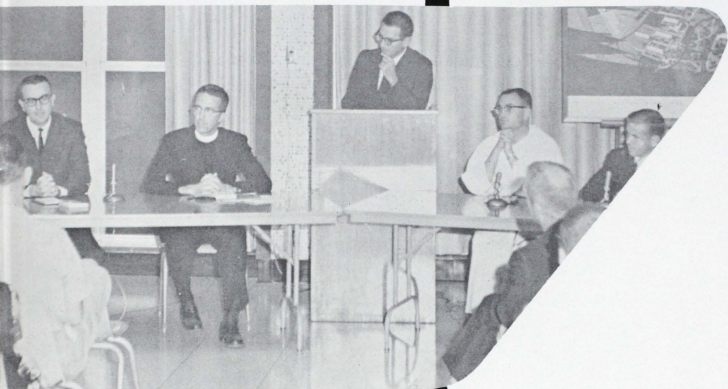

LEGEND

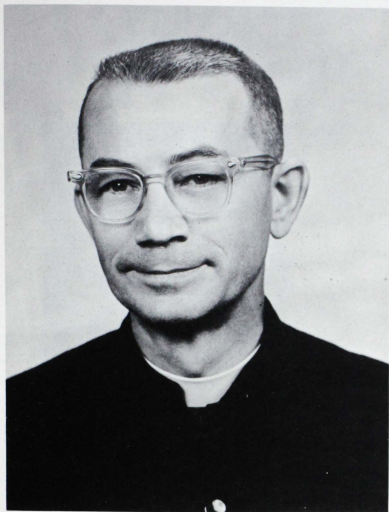

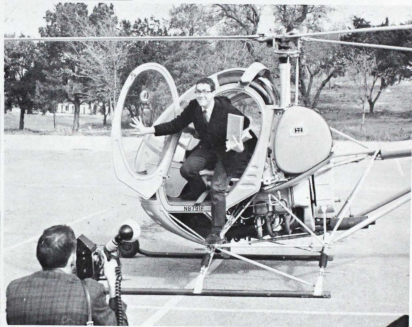
WRITING II

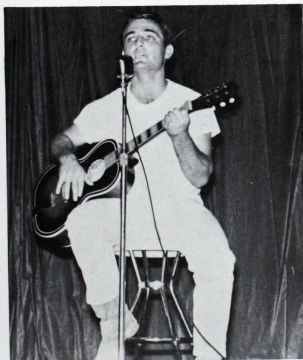

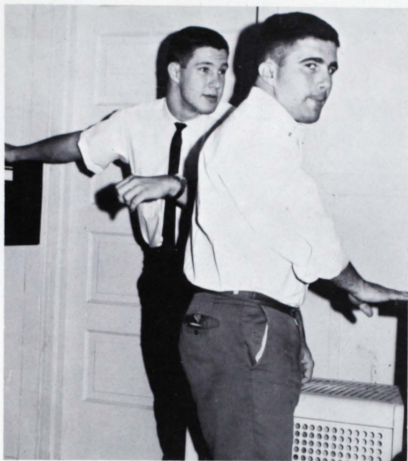

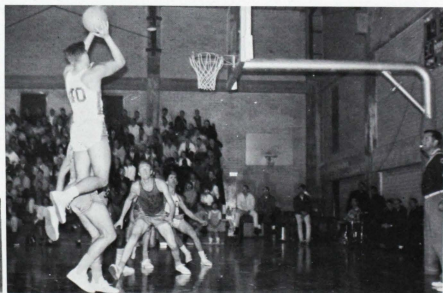

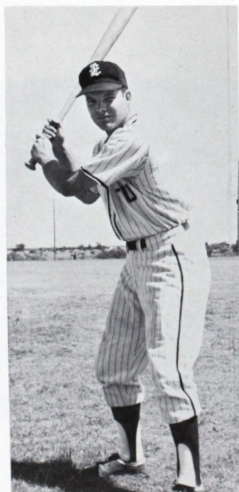

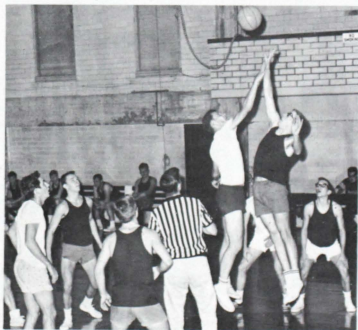

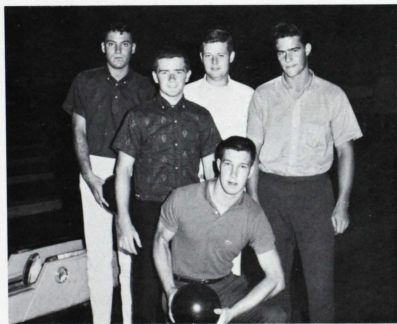

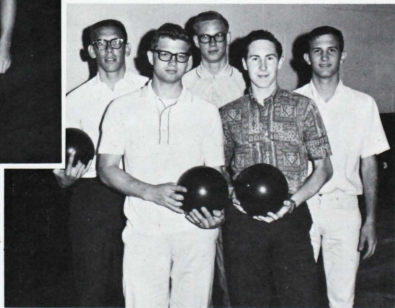

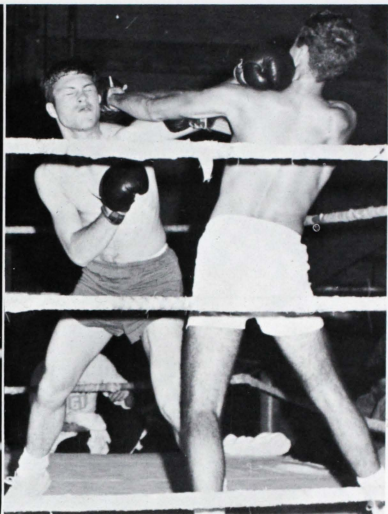

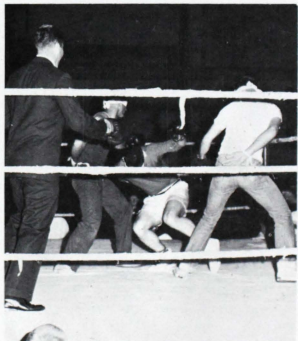

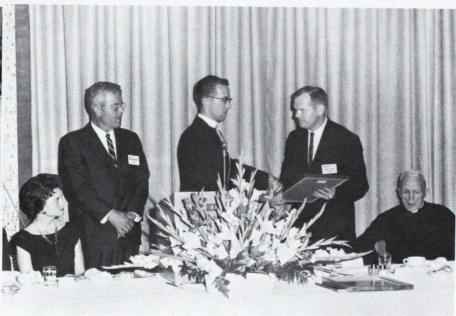
