




It is the hope of the editors of the TIGER to portray within these pages the effects of these principles upon our relationship with our fellowmen through this year of our lives as students of St. Edward's.

We'll think of you so very much; And that is true. We'll long remember Your helpful ways, your unselfish service, Your generosity, your wonderful deeds . . . so much.








