





PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Commencement Day, 1961

Dear Edsman of the Class of 1961:

Your college career was inaugurated auspiciously enough, four years ago, with the launching of the first artificial satellite into an orbit around the earth.

These first four years of the Space Age have been marked by other less spectacular but sometimes equally important changes. Colonial empires of centuries' standing have melted away and new nations have emerged at an unprecedented rate. The reindustrialization of West Germany and Japan is reversing America's balance of world trade. Automation is bringing about a new industrial revolution. The international deployment of atomic weapons raises new questions about the survival of the human race.

These and other problems of greater or lesser moment challenge us in this changing world. New problems call for new solutions; new emphases demand new techniques. Had you come to college merely for exercise in problem solving and technical training, your college education would already be outdated in 1961 - and who can imagine the problems and emphases that will confront us in ten or twenty years?

You are fortunate that yours has been a liberal education. With deep roots in the unchanging principles of God, man and society and a grasp of the basic principles of your chosen profession, you have not ignored the questions posed by the changing scene of the past four years. Together with your teachers and your fellow students, you have applied your newly acquired knowledge to contemporary affairs. But we trust that you realize that even these were only passing applications of the principles, and that you will be called upon in the future to make new but valid applications to novel problems and shifting emphases.










