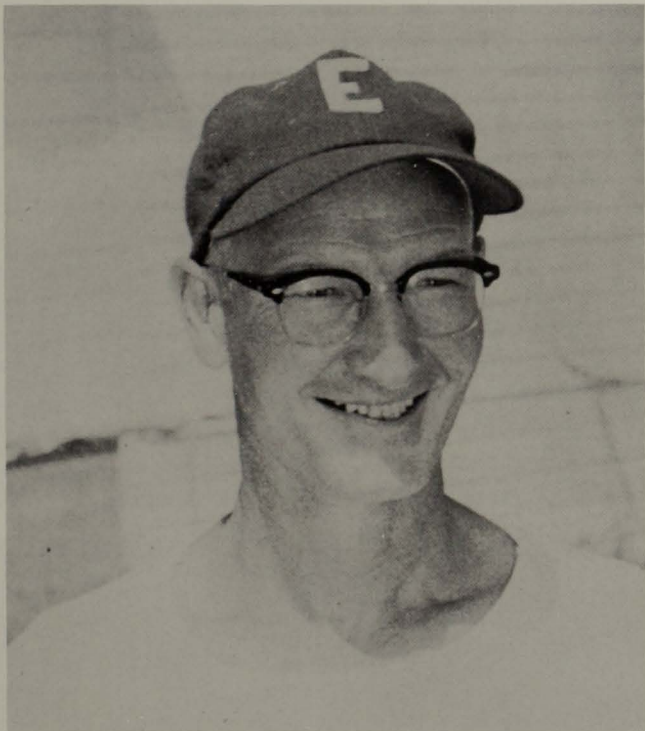
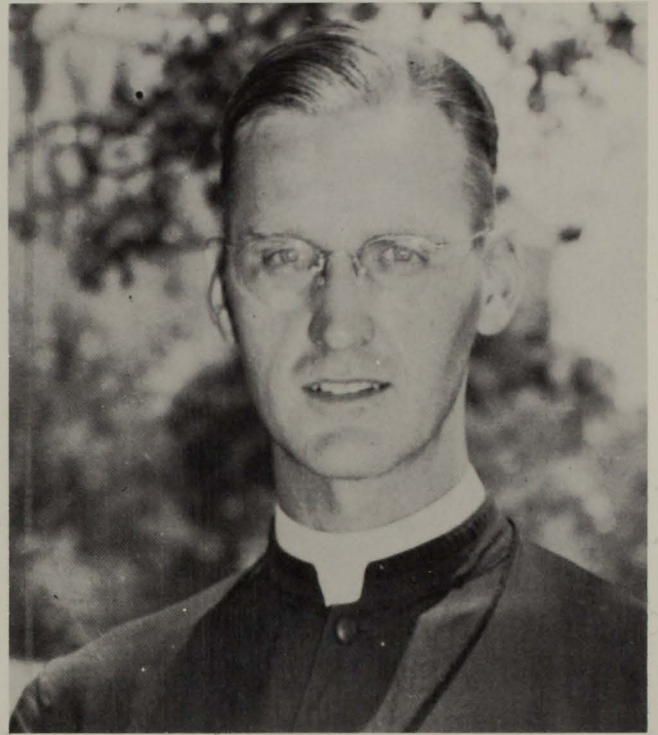
St. Ed's "hot and cold" Hilltoppers parlayed a fast breaking offense and plenty of hustle on defense for a 14-9 won-lost record for the season, and a fine .609 percentage. The Edsmen finished third in Big State Conference play, despite the fact that they usually put on the floor a much shorter team than their opposition. The height average was just a shade under 6'1" this year. Thanks to a strong bench, the 'Toppers stopped their last five games, including a heart-stopping 70-69 overtime over East Texas Baptist.

The transmitter was designed by Rudy Fernandez, and built by Fernandez and Art Arber.

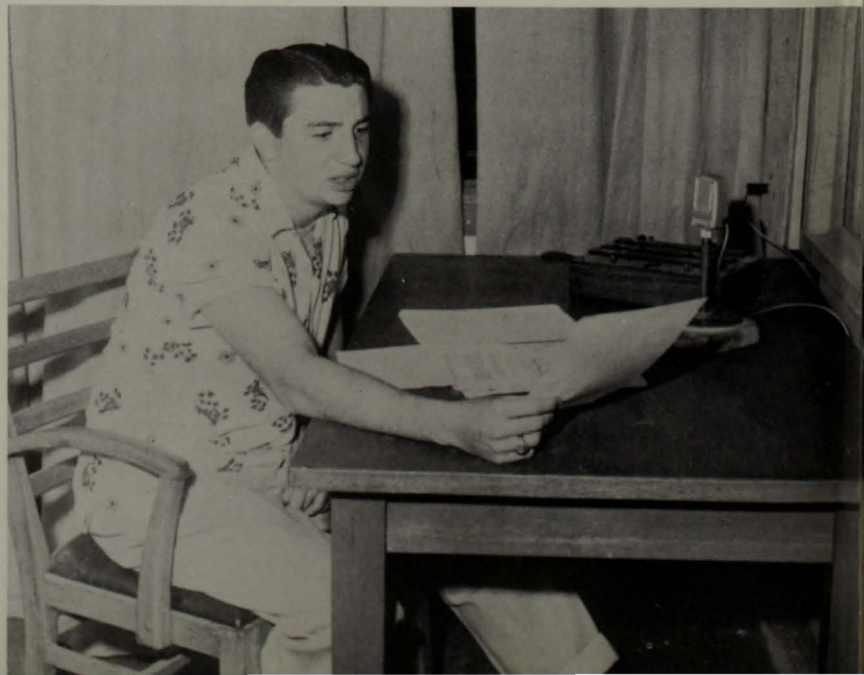

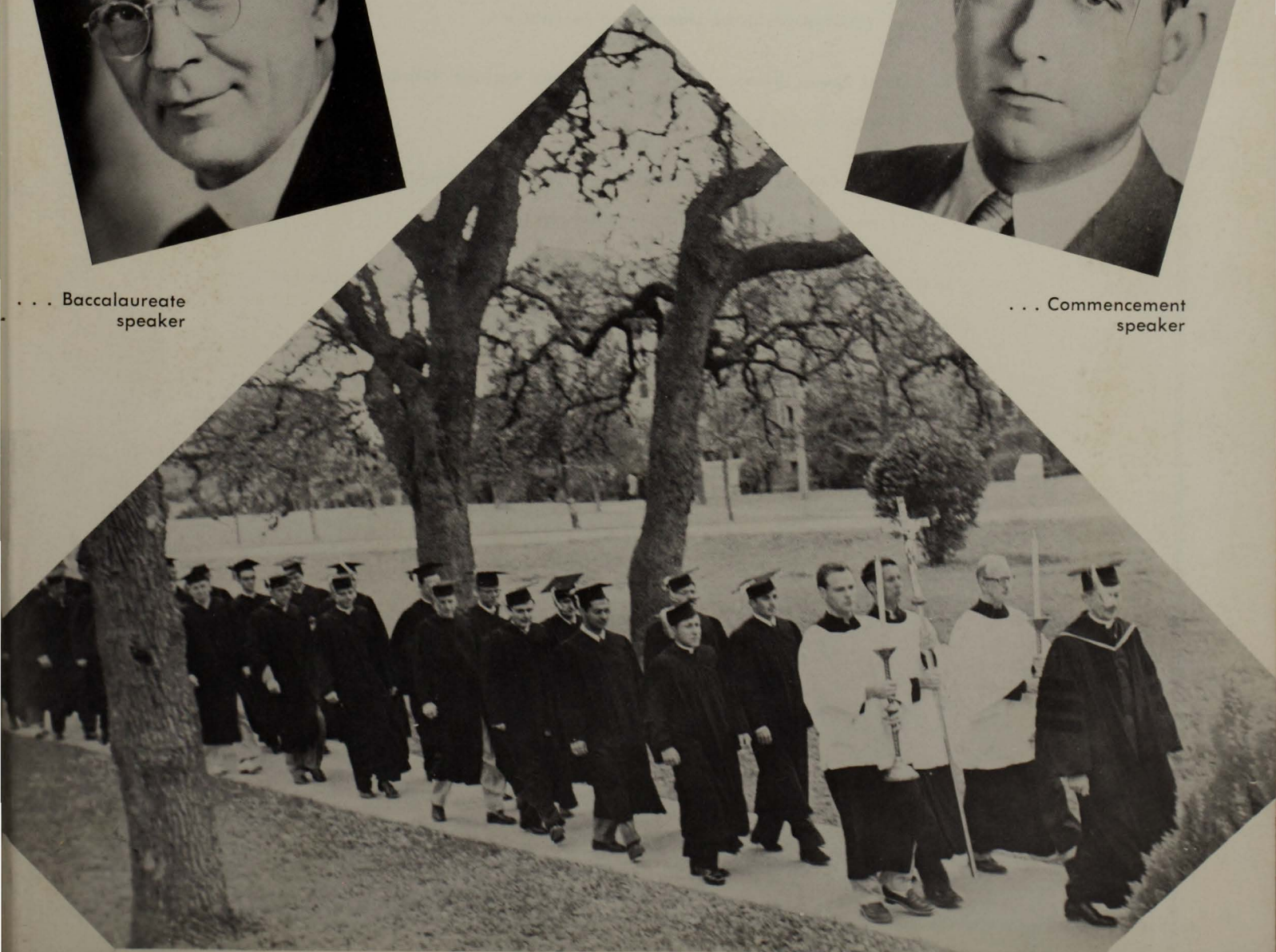
